

## Information Regarding Tybee Island

Date

The field study trip to Tybee Island will be March 23<sup>rd</sup> -March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2015. Students will leave Atlanta at approximately **6:00 a.m.** on departure day and return to school at **3:00 p.m.**, on arrival day.

## Purpose

The purpose of the trip is twofold:

- To fulfill the Georgia Performance Standards for the grade level in the most effective manner possible through direct hands-on experience. Understanding of concepts learned in the classroom is greatly enhanced when students experience the real world application of these concepts.
- 2. To gain an awareness of and appreciation for the natural environment. We are a part of, not apart from, the environment and only through an understanding of how the natural world "works" can we appreciate nature's beauty.

Instruction

A variety of activities and projects are prepared by the teachers and the Burton 4-H Center staff at Tybee Island. The activities will be those learning experiences specifically applicable to marine education and the natural surroundings of the area.

Classes

Marsh Ecology; Fort Pulaski Tour; Crabs & Critters; Invertebrate Study, Orienteering; 4-H led Campfire; Squid Dissection; Teacher led walk on the beach or to the ice cream shoppe.

Group

The group will consist of **TAG 5**<sup>th</sup> grade students at Stonewall Tell who have paid for the field trip and have parental permission to join the trip. This number will be approximately **156 (incl. other Elementary Schools).** Any student unable to attend the trip will remain at school and follow a normal classroom schedule with his/her **5**<sup>th</sup> grade teacher.

Trans.

Transportation to Tybee Island will be provided by **American Odyssey Travel** which is a licensed carrier, approved for the trip to Tybee Island.

<u>Costs</u>

The cost for this trip is approximately **§ 215.00** per person. This will cover all expenses, including, bus, food and lodging.

Supervision

Responsibility for supervision and discipline will be assumed by the teachers, the principal, instructors and parent chaperones. The ratio of adults to students is approximately 1:8.

Center

The Burton 4-H Center is a satellite campus of the University of Georgia, operated by the Cooperative Extension Service. The Cooperative Extension Service also conducts Environmental Education programs at the Jekyll Island 4-H Center, Wausega 4-H Center in Dahlonega and the Rock Eagle 4-H Center in Eatonton.
